Featured Artist

Jim Abele



I interviewed Jim Abele in his home, which he built 12 years ago, and where he lives with his wife Dottie. Jim, a long-time CMCAL member, was Director of the Art League's Prickly Pear Gallery for over a year. His paintings can be seen at the William Ris Gallery in Stone Harbor, and at his studio at 27 Delair, Townbank.

CMCAL: At what age did you start "making art"?

Jim: I was 25 years old. It was my late wife's idea. She thought I would make a good artist, so she bought me a set of oil paints. I tried them and I was hooked. I've been painting ever since. I studied under Hal Singer and Maggie Weston, and I've also taken classes at Fleisher.

CMCAL: Why is oils your favorite medium?

Jim: I like the texture of oils. I love to paint using a palette knife for the most part, with some brush. I'm also archival – I think about my paintings lasting for years, so I stretch my own canvas and use copper tacks instead of staples. If the piece requires gessoing, whether on canvas or panels, I do that myself, too. I've enjoyed teaching oil painting as well. I've also done stained glass. I started 18 years ago and have taught it in my studio. I did my own designs, did some commissions and sold a lot.

CMCAL: What are some of your other favorite pastimes?

Jim: Music. I have a full-sized keyboard in my studio. I played accordion for years. I was in a trio for 20 years, and we performed at weddings and in nightclubs in the Burlington County area. We

played dinner music, old standards, 30's, 40's and 50's tunes. I've even played the Hammond organ at "The Inn" in Villas. I also like metal detecting, because I'm very interested in old coins. I've found several valuable coins over the years, one of which I just sold for \$600.

CMCAL: Have you always lived in New Jersey?

Jim: Yes, I was born in Burlington, NJ. I still have family there – brothers and children. I lived there until 1989, when I moved to Cape May County. I was married at 17; my wife was 16. We had four children, two boys, two girls. I now have five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. My father was German, and his father, my grandfather, was a starving artist! My Italian mother sang a lot – everything was music with her. So my love of art and music is rooted in my family.

CMCAL: What is the most interesting place you've been to in the last five years?

Jim: Well, I've traveled all over Florida, and I love the Keys, but most interesting to me are my family reunions in Pittsburgh. My mother's family is there. She was one of 11 children, so there are lots of cousins and we have a great time when we get together.

CMCAL: What do you consider your best accomplishment?

Jim- Maintaining a business for 40 years. It started as a masonry business and turned into building homes. We went by "Abele Construction". My dad started the business, then my brother and I joined him. Later, my brother went into real estate, and my dad left the business to me. Another great accomplishment was raising four children, one of them being mentally challenged. He is 53 now and is such a kind and loving person. He lives in a medical group home.

CMCAL: What are your goals for the future?

Jim: Being a diabetic for 29 years, I'd like to maintain my health for a long time so I can plein air paint, which I love to do.

CMCAL: Jim, it has been a real pleasure to visit with you. You are truly a self-made man. Your versatility, creativity and connection with nature astound me. You have that talent of making something out of nothing, too. Like the fallen branches that you pick up on your walks and make into walking sticks. I'm sure I am one of many who hope you continue making art for a long, long time.
